The mission of this training is to equip families of Children and Youth with Special Healthcare Needs with the necessary skills to share their stories well in a variety of settings and modes of delivery in order to bring awareness and change to the system of care for children with special needs.

In this training, participants will:

- 1. Understand the essential value of their family experience
- 2. Craft a story from their lived experience for awareness and change
- 3. Develop presentation skills for a variety of settings

Participants will work with a coach and small cohort of family storytellers. This 9-week course is a blend of in-person, online assignments and Zoom storytelling sessions.
